How can all the organisations work together and support each other

Thanks to the continued support from the Hindu organisations, this year witnessed 85 representatives from 55 Hindu organisations comprising Temples, community language schools, community-based organisations and associations participating in the forum. Representatives from each organisation briefly talked about the activities of their respective organisation and then put forward one or two points on one of the suggested themes.
