7th Annual HOTA Forum

The Hindu community of New South Wales came together for another eventful HOTA Annual meeting on 22nd May 2021 at Rouse Hill Community Centre, Rouse Hill, NSW. The event was organized in a grand style by the incoming host Hare Krishna Community and Cultural Centre, a division of ISKCON Sydney. This year marked 7th year of HOTA Forum Annual meeting that was launched in 3rd National Hindu Conference in Sydney in 2014.

In his remarks, he congratulated ISKCON for constructing their temple in the North West suburb of Vineyard which will serve the entire North West Sydney community and he assured he will provide full support for construction of the temple. Ms Durga Owen conveyed the greeting message on behalf of Hon Julie Owens, Federal MP. She appreciated the contributions of HOTA members during Covid-19 pandemic in 2020.
